## **Emerald Heights Model United Nations**

We hosted the fifth edition of Emerald Heights Model United Nations (EHMUN) which spanned for three days. It was a student run event and our students worked ardently for more than 6 months with guidance and support from the teachers to make the event successful. All the committees were chaired by our students and apart from that the logistical requirements were also handled by them. Apart from the event itself, the preparation also shaped the students as individuals. It ingrained the skills of time management, heavy research, team work and created awareness about the world as a whole. The agendas picked for various committees were major world issues at hand. 300 young minds from 21 schools across the country debated, negotiated and tried to find a common solution to the problems that plague the world today.

UNSC discussed the situation in Afghanistan. UNHRC discussed the right to personal privacy, something that everyone can relate to these days. The topic of discussion in Press Corps was 'Enhancing the potential and power of penmanship' while DISEC discussed upon Countering maritime piracy with special reference to the Arabian Sea and The Malacca Straits. NATO discussed the NATO Israel Relations in the post Iran era as well as the strategic perspectives of the Black Sea and the Balkans issue. Lastly, the United States Senate debated upon Immigration Policy Reforms. The Executive Board along with the Organizing Committee had gone through heavy and rigorous training and it paid off.

The Emerald Heights International School, Choithram Netralaya, Indore Cancer Foundation Charitable Trust (ICF) and all other stakeholders helped ICU2 Eye Camp 2019 to reach more under privileged compared to the last one. The students and teachers of the Emerald Heights and Ermitage contributed to the huge success of our 2nd annual ICU2 Eye Camp held from 23-26 February, 2019, wherein 21,000 patients were diagnosed, 20,650 spectacles were distributed, 400 received free cataract treatment and 750 were checked for oral cancer. The camp was organized in collaboration with Friends of Round Square (FRS) and ICU2. The project aimed at providing free-of-cost eye check-ups and cataract operations to the underprivileged. This year camp also included a dental check-up for oral cancer by dentists. Forty-five students and eight teachers from Ermitage School and fifty students from the Emerald Heights were part of this community service project.

The camp was held at three different locations including Emerald Heights School campus, Khajrana, a locality in Indore and Dewas, a city near Indore.

Before the camp there was a lecture given by Dr. Digpal Dharkar of Indian Institute of Head & Neck Oncology, a cancer hospital run by Indore Cancer Foundation Charitable Trust (ICF), about the habits and lifestyles causing cancer and how to prevent it.

The students visited Choithram Fountain School and the Indore Deaf Bilingual Academy and after the camp, the French students visited Mandu, an ancient fort city.



## **Experiencing the SCIENCE of the world**

ne of our students participated in the STEM based program on full scholarship in USA, which provided a platform to 31 students from 10 different countries to interact, live and sit in the same classroom together, thus developing intercultural learning and broadening our perspective of STEM as a subject. This STEM Academy was located at Elmhurst College, Elmhurst, a small but lively town 30 minutes away from Chicago, Illinois and he stayed in the campus and shared a room with another participant from a different country.

The STEM Academy's purpose was simple. It was not to generate interest in science, because all the students were already enthusiasts in the field, rather it was to bring a group of diverse students of the same age group to discuss not only the science which was taught in the class but also of the country they belonged to, learn from each other and go back knowing you have not only learnt but experienced the SCIENCE of the World. The program was sponsored by British Petroleum, along with AFS and was organised in three different locations all round the world including USA, Egypt and Brazil.

## Collegiate Level Mathematics class by The University of Waterloo, Canada




