There were more than thousand students from all across the country were competing. A team of five students was selected and trained for more than five months by the Indian Schools Debating Society to participate in the world championship. The team was trained by some of the best debaters of the world, including Dhruva Bhat (Harvard and Oxford), Sayega Islam (one of the world's best debating coaches) and Varshini Venkatesh. The competition was originally supposed to take place in Mexico, but was taken online due to COVID-19 global pandemic. More than 60 countries were part of the championship. Team India beat Indonesia, Mongolia, Bangladesh and New Zealand on Motions ranging from "This House prefers a world where all land was held in government trust and leased out on limited-term contracts" to "This House would replace human judgment with computer algorithms in criminal sentencing decisions." Team India stood among the Top-12 teams in their division.

### **International Competition for Young Debaters**

In an another world's prestigious and largest debating competition for students under 15, International Competition for Young Debaters, Purab Seth was selected by the Indian Schools Debating Society. The competition was organized by Oxford University and Cambridge University. In the competition, more than three hundred teams participated. Purab was selected to be part of the team of two and was trained by the Indian Schools Debating Society. The topics ranged from implementing a mandatory environmental draft system to forcing multinationals to follow the labour standards set in the country of their origin.




### **Pradhyumna Singh Rathod**



### **Emerald Heights hosted the World's Biggest Round Square International Conference**

The Emerald Heights International School hosted the world's biggest Round Square International Conference from October 02-08, 2019. Over six days more than 700 student delegates and 300 adult delegates of 157 schools from 33 countries across the world came together at the Emerald Heights for the Round Square International Conference 2019 (RSIC 2019). The theme of the conference was Sarvodaya-The World We Wish To See. Sarvodaya is a Sanskrit word meaning progress for all. The conference logo is the world being raised up by hands from different parts of the world. It signifies that we should mould the world and ourselves into what we wish to see.

It was a week of multinational and multicultural experience in which delegates from different countries, cultures and perspectives came together to share, learn, understand and, be inspired to make a positive difference in the world – to begin to create a route map to **The World We Wish To See**.

#### **Keynote Speakers**

The world's renowned keynote speakers from diverse fields and discussion panels throughout the conference ignited delegates' curiosity and challenged their perceptions.

The opening speaker was Shri Kailash Satyarthi, a child's rights activist who was awarded a Nobel Peace Prize in 2014 for his struggle against the suppression of children and young people and for the right of all children to education. During his keynote he urged delegates to expand the horizons of their thoughts and be visionaries. The topic of Shri Satyarthi's keynote speech was, "Compassion and Youth".

Also on the opening day, delegates heard from Honorable Dr. Shashi Tharoor, an Indian politician, writer and a former career international diplomat who is currently serving as Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha) explored the themes of democracy and globalization. The topic of Dr. Tharoor's keynote speech was, "India in Transition: From Midnight to Millenium and Beyond".

As the conference progressed, Hanson Robotics brought us Sophia, a social humanoid robot that uses artificial intelligence, visual data processing and facial recognition and is the first robot to receive citizenship of any country.

Our next speaker was Ms. Kiran Gandhi, an electronic music producer, drummer, artist and activist. She is also known by her stage name Madame Gandhi. Her music career includes being a touring drummer for artists M.I.A., Thievery Corporation, and Kehlani. Gandhi's music and activism focuses on female empowerment and fourth-wave feminism. She encouraged students to use their passion for purpose, and then invited the students on stage to perform with her! The topic of Ms. Gandhi's keynote speech was, "Own Your Voice: Using Passion For Purpose".

Delegates were fortunate to begin their final day of the conference with a 3K run for cancer alongside Major D.P. Singh, a retired officer of the Indian Army, war veteran who is known as India's first blade runner, and who later addressed the conference. Major Singh has run 26 half marathons using a prosthetic 'blade' leg. During his keynote he motivated students to take charge of their life "You are the Boss of your life and once you recognise that, then no hurdle or challenge is big enough for you." he said. The topic of Major Singh's keynote speech was, "I am the Boss".



Every year the conference is hosted by different member schools in different parts of the world around mid-September or October. The conference gives high-school students various opportunities to express themselves, debate on topical issues, forge friendships, supports local communities, and develop an international understanding. 


### **Field Trips**

Interactive Programme on Solar Eclipse

### Our Students interacted with Retired ISRO Scientists

r. Prabhakar Sharma (Retired ISRO Senior Scientist), Dr. Suyash Dake (Former ISRO Scientist and Director, Sunday Science School), and Mr. S.P. Jaiswal (Director, Indore Science Center) addressed the students of the school. The main objective of the programme was to discuss the forthcoming solar eclipse of 26th December, 2019. Dr. Sharma and Dr. Dake explained why a solar eclipse occurs and the various superstitions that persist in the society about the solar and lunar eclipses. These scientists emphasized that contrary to the popular belief that watching eclipses brings bad luck for the viewers, solar eclipses offer a unique opportunity to study solar atmosphere and the various processes that are associated with it. This is because during an eclipse the solar disc is covered partially/fully which offers scientists a unique opportunity to view it (using appropriate filters) which is normally not possible as the solar disc is very bright and therefore cannot be viewed directly with an unaided eye. Mr. Jaiswal explained the use of special goggles (developed by Dr. Dake) that were brought along by him for viewing the solar disc during a solar eclipse. Students asked several questions concerning the various phenomena associated with solar eclipse, such as the formation of a diamond ring, etc. Dr. Sharma also explained various challenges, opportunities and excitement associated with a career in science, particularly space science.






